## LIST OF MEASURES REQUESTED FROM MIKE MADELENA FOR ANNUAL FRAMEWORK REPORT

- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine for Female Adolescents (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) percentage of female adolescents that turned 13 years old during the measurement year and had three doses of the HPV vaccine by their 13<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- 2.) Weight Assessment and Counseling for Nutrition and Physical Activity for Children/Adolescents: Body Mass Index Assessment for Children/Adolescents – (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) - the percentage of members 3 to 17 years of age continuously enrolled for calendar year that had an outpatient visit with a primary care practitioner or obstetrical/gynecological, and whose weight is classified based on body mass index percentile for age and gender during the measurement year.
- 3.) <u>Child and Adolescent Access to Primary Care Practitioners</u> (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) percentage of children and adolescents ages 12 months to 19 years that had a visit with a PCP, including four separate percentages: Children ages 12 to 24 months and 25 months to 6 years that had a visit with a PCP during the measurement year; Children ages 7 to 11 years and adolescents ages 12 to 19 years that had a visit with a PCP during the measurement year or the year prior to the measurement year.
- 4.) <u>Childhood Immunizations</u> (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) the percentage of children 2 years of age during the measurement year and had specific vaccines by their second birthday. The measure calculates a rate for each vaccine and nine combination rates.)
- 5.) <u>Adolescent Immunizations</u> (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) Percentage of adolescents who turned 13 years of age during the measurement year and had specific vaccines by their 13<sup>th</sup> birthday. The measure calculates a rate for each vaccine and one combination rate.
- 6.) <u>Developmental Screening in the First Three Years of Life</u> (Measure Steward: CAHMI/NCQA) assesses the extent to which children at various ages from 0-36 months were screened for social and emotional development with a standardized documented tool or set of tools.
- 7.) <u>Annual Pediatric Hemoglobin A1C Testing</u> (Measure Steward: NCQA) percentage of children ages 5 to 17 with diabetes (type 1 and type 2) that had a Hemoglobin A1c test during the measurement year
- 8.) <u>Wellness Visits First 15 Months</u> (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) the percentage of members that turned 15 months old during the measurement year and had zero, one, two, three, four, five, or six or more well-child visits with a primary care practitioner during their first 15 months of life.
- 9.) <u>Well Child Visits in the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> Years of Life</u> (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) these measures estimate the number of children ages three to six that had one or more well-child visits with a primary care physician.
- 10.) Adolescent Well-Care Visit (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) these measures estimate the number of children ages 12-19 years of age that had at least one comprehensive well-care visit with a primary care physician or obstetrical/gynecological provider during the measurement year.
- 11.) <u>Percentage of Eligibles That Received Preventive Dental Services</u> (Measure Steward: CMS) percentage of individuals ages 1 through 18 that are enrolled in CHIP, are eligible for EPSDT services, and that received preventive dental services.
- 12.) Percentage of Eligibles That Received Dental Treatment Services (Measure Steward: CMS) percentage of individuals ages 1 to 18 that are enrolled in CHIP, are eligible for EPSDT services, and that received dental treatment services.
- 13.)Medication Management for People with Asthma (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) percentage of children ages 5 to 19 that were identified as having persistent asthma and were dispensed appropriate medications that they remained on during the treatment period. Two rates are reported: percentage of children on an asthma controller medication for at least 50 percent of their treatment period; percentage of children that remained on an asthma controller medication for at least 75 percent of their treatment period. This measure is reported using the following age ranges: 5 to 11 years; 12 to 18 years.

- 14.) Follow-Up after Hospitalization for Mental Illness (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) percentage of discharges for children ages 6 to 19 that were hospitalized for treatment of selected mental health disorders and that had an outpatient visit, an intensive outpatient encounter, or partial hospitalization with a mental health practitioner within 7 days of discharge and within 30 days of discharge.
- 15.) Follow-Up Care for Children Prescribed Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) Medication (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) percentage of children newly prescribed ADHD medication that had at least three follow-up care visits within a 10-month period, one of which was within 30 days from the time the first ADHD medication was dispensed, including two rates: one for the initiation phase and one for the continuation and maintenance phase.
- 16.) <u>Annual Percentage of Asthma Patients 2 through 18 Years Old with One or More Asthma-Related</u> <u>Emergency Room Visits</u> – (Measure Steward: Alabama Medicaid) – percentage of children ages 2 to 19 diagnosed with asthma during the measurement year with one or more asthma-related emergency room (ER) visits.
- 17.)<u>Ambulatory Care Emergency Department (ED) Visits</u> (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) Rate of ED visits per 1,000 enrollee months among children up to age 19.

## List of reports requested by WVCHIP Executive Director Annually:

- 1. <u>Adult Diabetes Measure applied to children</u> (Measure Steward: NCQA/HEDIS) percentage of pediatric patients with Type I and Type II diabetes with a hemoglobin A1c test in a twelve-month measurement period. Criteria also collected for those children with Type I and Type II diabetes that had serum cholesterol level screening; an eye exam, and a screen for kidney disease.
- 2. <u>Preventive Dental Visit</u> the total number of unduplicated children receiving preventive dental services for the entire calendar year.
- 3. <u>Annual Dental Visit</u> estimates the number of children continuously enrolled for calendar year, ages 2 to 19, which had at least one dental visit during the year.
- 4. <u>Treatment Dental Visit</u> estimates the number of children continuously enrolled for calendar year, ages 2 to 19, which had at least one dental treatment visit during the measurement year.
- 5. <u>Vision</u> estimates the number of children continuously enrolled for calendar year who received a vision visit.
- 6. <u>Utilization Rate/CHIP Expenditures/Services/Enrollment</u> estimates cost of services per member per year for: Dental; Vision; Asthma; ER; Immunization Services, and Well-Child Visits.
